Radio Presenter prepares and presents news, sports or other information, conducts interviews, and introduces music, performances and special events on radio.

Qualification

Highly relevant major fields of study include:

- Broadcast Journalism, Media Studies, Radio and Television, and Radio Announcing are relevant fields of study for this occupation.
- Broadcast journalism is the study of the methods and technique for reporting, producing, and delivering news and news programs via radio, television, and video/film media, and is a program that prepares individuals to be professional broadcast journalists, editors, producers, directors, and managers.
- Radio Announcing is a field of study that focuses on a range of journalistic, presentation, technical and people skills required by today's electronic media.
- Adjusts production equipment and plays music and advertisements
- Reads advertisements or introduces and announces sponsored items
- May announce or commentate at sporting or special events, or introduce entertainment such as live or recorded music at entertainment venues
- Introduces programs, music, entertainment items, guests and celebrities
- Prepares and reads news bulletins, makes special announcements and provides commentary for sports and other events
- Presents opinions on sports, politics, and social and economic matters
- Researches, investigates and compiles stories and programs

This occupation requires a qualification assessed as comparable to the education level of an Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) Bachelor degree or higher degree and in a field highly relevant to the nominated occupation.
