Job description

Industrial Pharmacists undertake research, testing and analysis related to the development, production, storage, quality control and distribution of drugs and related supplies.


Occupations not considered under this ANZSCO code:

- > Chemist
- > Pharmacologist (Non-clinical)
- Clinical Pharmacologist

These occupations are classified elsewhere in ANZSCO.

Industrial Pharmacist is a VETASSESS Group A occupation.

This occupation requires a qualification assessed as comparable to the educational level of an Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) Bachelor degree or higher, in a field highly relevant to the nominated occupation.



The information below describes the available pathways for a Skills Assessment under**Group A**. Please note that in order to achieve a successful Skills Assessment Outcome, a positive assessment for both qualifications and employment is required.

Pathway 1

This pathway requires a qualification assessed as comparable to the education level of an Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) Bachelor degree or higher degree and in a field highly relevant to the nominated occupation.

Bachelor degree or higher degree includes AQF Master Degree or AQF Doctoral Degree.

In addition, it is essential for applicants to meet the following employment criteria:

- y at least one year of post-qualification employment at an appropriate skill level, undertaken in the last five years,
- working 20 hours or more per week, and
- highly relevant to the nominated occupation.

Qualification

* This includes qualifications assessed at AQF Bachelor, Master and Doctoral level.

Highly relevant major fields of study include:

- > Pharmacy
- Industrial Pharmacy
- > Pharmaceutical Science

Employment

Highly relevant tasks include:

- Conducting research to develop and improve pharmaceuticals, cosmetics and related chemical products;
- Conferring with Chemists, Engineering Professionals and other professionals about manufacturing techniques and ingredients;
- Testing and analysing drugs to determine their identity, purity and strength in relation to specified standards;
- Developing standards for drugs used in pharmaceuticals.

Employment Information

Industrial Pharmacists usually work in industrial laboratories or clinical environments. The major industries for Industrial Pharmacists are manufacturing, professional, scientific and technical services, and education and training, as well as pharmaceutical manufacturing companies or research organisations. Industrial Pharmacists may also work in areas of quality assurance, regulatory services, and the marketing and provision of drug information.
