Job description

Nutritionists integrate, disseminate and apply knowledge drawn from the relevant sciences to enhance positive effects of food on the health and well-being of human populations.

The information below describes the available pathways for a Skills Assessment under Group A. Please note that in order to achieve a suitable Skills Assessment Outcome, a suitable assessment for both qualifications and employment is required.

Pathway 1

This pathway requires a qualification assessed as comparable to the education level of an Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) Bachelor degree or higher degree and in a field highly relevant to the nominated occupation.

Bachelor degree or higher degree includes AQF Master Degree or AQF Doctoral Degree.

In addition, it is essential for applicants to meet the following employment criteria:

- > at least **one** year of post-qualification employment at an appropriate skill level, undertaken in the last five years,
- > working 20 hours or more per week, and
- > highly relevant to the nominated occupation.

Qualification

This occupation requires a qualification in Nutrition.

This includes qualifications assessed at AQF Bachelor, Master and Doctoral level.

Employment

Highly relevant tasks include:

- Collecting, organising and assessing data relating to health and nutritional status of individuals, groups and communities;
- Interpreting and communicating scientific information and providing advice, education and professional opinion to individuals, groups and communities;
- Monitoring food intake and quality to provide nutritional care;
- Calculating nutritional values of food served;
- Planning, conducting and evaluating nutrition intervention programs and compiling educational material;
- Providing nutrition assessments, nutrition management, and nutrition education, research and training.

Employment information

Nutritionists may design, coordinate, implement and evaluate a range of population health interventions to improve the wellbeing of individuals, communities, and the population as a whole, through better food and nutrition. Nutritionists may work in a number of other roles, including research and as Nutrition Consultants and Advisors, Public Health and Health Promotion Officers, Community Development Officers, Quality and Nutrition Coordinators, Food Technologists, Media Spokespeople and more. They mainly work in health care and social assistance, retail trade, and manufacturing industries.
