


Hairdresser

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Occupation Description:

Hairdressers cut, style, colour, straighten and permanently wave hair, and treat hair and scalp conditions.



Their job involves:

- > providing advice on hair care, beauty products and hairstyles
- > shampooing hair and conditioning scalps
- > colouring, straightening and permanently waving hair with chemical solutions
- > cutting hair with scissors, clippers and razors
- > styling hair into dreadlocks and braids and adding hair extensions
- > shaving and trimming beards and moustaches
- > cleaning work areas and sanitising instruments
- > arranging appointments and collecting payments
- > may clean, colour, cut and style wigs and hairpieces

NOTE: This occupation is for general hairdressers working in women's, men's or unisex salons and performing a variety of tasks, including cutting, colouring, straightening, waving and styling hair. It does not extend to positions in a limited service setting, such as cut and blow dry only hair salons.

How will I be assessed?

Stage 1: Documentary Evidence Assessment

We will review your documentary evidence to ensure it meets the employment and training requirements and indicates that you have the necessary skills, knowledge and experience as a Hairdresser.

Stage 2: Technical Assessment

If you are successful in Stage 1, you will complete a technical interview with our assessor. The technical interview will be conducted in English and no interpreters are allowed.

What skills and knowledge do I need?

The qualification relevant to this occupation is the SHB30416 Certificate III in Hairdressing.

To be awarded this qualification, you must demonstrate your skills and knowledge in the units of competency listed in the table below. Each unit of competency defines a selection of knowledge and skills required in Australian workplaces.

You must achieve 28 units of competency:

- > 21 core units
- > 7 elective units.

What will I receive after the assessment?

If you successfully complete Stage 2 you will receive:

> A Skills Assessment Result Letter to support your visa application.

And if applying under Pathway 1:

> An Australian Certificate III qualification and a Statement of Results.

If you are unsuccessful in Stage 2 you will receive:

> A Skills Assessment Result Letter.

And if applying under Pathway 1:

- > A Statement of Attainment that lists the units of competency you have successfully achieved
- > A Statement of Results that lists the units of competency you have successfully achieved and those that were not achieved.
